Mason the wife of the first part John M. Mason of the second part.
Mason & Alexander Peete a man which will amount of Edward Pitts Esq
of the third part all of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia wherein
the said James Myrick is in debt to the said Alex. Peete as adm^r & ad aforesaid
in the sum of one thousand three hundred and one dollars ⁷⁵ to be paid by bond payable 23rd day
of Decr. 1829 also in the like sum due by bond and payable the 23rd day of December 1830
also by the sum Nine hundred twenty six dollars ⁷⁵ to be paid by bond due and payable the 23rd day
of December 1831 and in the further sum of three hundred twenty five dollars ⁷⁵
due and payable on the said 23 December 1831 all which bonds shall bear interest till
present and whence the said James Myrick is desirous effectually to secure the payment
of the said several sum of money with the accruing interest as they shall respectively
fall due This Indenture therefore witnesseth that for and in consideration
of the premises and of the sum of one dollar to them in hand paid by the said John M. Mason
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged they the said James Myrick
and the said Pitts have granted bargained sold and conveyed and by these presents
do grant bargain sell and convey unto the said John M. Mason his heirs and
affinity that certain tract or parcel of Land situate in the County aforesaid to him
conveyed by the said Pitts as aforesaid with the mill named of Edward Pitts and
containing four hundred and sixty five acres with the appurtenances thereto the fol-
lowing negro slaves with their future increase is all Patrick Jack Eliza
Cambridge Fiddler Henry Beck Matilda Nancy Mary Beck and Eliza
To have and to hold to him the said John M. Mason and his heirs and
affinity forever upon the said Entsch. New ordeled that the said John
M. Mason upon being thereof required by the said Pitts or affiant as the said sum of money
shall receive fully full and true being unpaid by the said Myrick shall proceed to sell
the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereto and the slaves with their increase
or so many of the slaves or so much of the land as shall be sufficient after deducting
