

to Stephen & their daughter for the benefit of the said Master or Equal date hereinafter all the said Cooper's interest in the lands held by him and his wife for her donee in her late husband Jacob William's lands also the following negro slaves held by the said Cooper and wife as her donee in the Estate of her said late Husband to wit Now Ralph John Ephraim & wife Jacob Eliza Pat Beck Kipley Pleasant & Isabel their Child with whom further in case also eight Masted sheep two one black and one brown being forty five Head of cattle two Hhds and fifty Head of hoggs all his household and Kitchen furniture plantation utensils with the increase of the same & chand all the Crops of Corn & other wheat and oats which are now under the plough and to hold to him the said Master the property aforesaid joint all its appurtenances to him and his heirs forever upon Trust nevertheless that the said Cooper is to retain possession of all the said property and to superintend and manage it to the best advantage that he is to raise and gather the Crops and sell the same and apply the proceeds to the relief of the said Master till until the said Master shall be required after the first day of January next by the said Promisor and to appear to take sight for the sale of said property when if the said Cooper shall have failed and not to the time of sale shall fail to give him security and fully discharge and release the said Promisor and himself from their respective security shall afford him the land etc on their aforesaid duty as aforesaid the time and place of sale for thirty days in a publick newspaper in the Town of Freeburg and publick Auction for cash the property herein before described and conveyed with its appurtenances and of the proceeds of such sale pay first the expenses of the Trust then the respective sums which the said Cooper shall be indebted to his said master and the surplus if any to the said Cooper or his heirs And the said Cooper covenants with the said Master that he shall have a good title to the said property for the purposes aforesaid And the said Cooper covenants that he will well and faithfully execute the said Trust And the said Promisor and Harris covenant that they will release the said property whenever they are released and discharged from their liability as secured aforesaid In Testimony whereof the several parties have set their hands and seals the same day and year first before written
