 dower in the Estate of her said deceased husband to wit: Two Negro John Abraham & Ann  
 Jacob, Eliza Pat. Beck, Kefey Pleasant & Isabel their child with their future increase  
 also Eight Mules three horses one Ox and one Sowing forty five head of Cattle two Hun-  
 dreds and fifty head of hog and one hundred and fifty head of turkeys and various other  
 with the increase of the stock and all the Crops of Corn Tobacco and oats which  
 are now due to the said Cooper and his wife to him the said Mason the property of said goods  
 all its appurtenances to him and his heirs forever. Trust never the less that the  
 said Cooper is to retain possession of all the said property and to support and  
 manage it to the best advantage that he is to raise and gather the Crops and sell the  
 same and apply the proceeds to the relief of the said slaves until the said Mason  
 shall be required after the first day of January next by the said Brown and  
 Harris to take effect for the sale of said property when if the said Cooper shall  
 have failed and up to the time of date shall fail to give sufficient security and fully  
 discharge and release the said Brown and Harris from their respective security.  
 That after said the said Mason shall after duly advertising the time and place of  
 sale for thirty days in a public Newspaper in the Town of Fredericksburg and  
 public Auction for cash the property herein before described and convey with  
 its appurtenances and of the proceeds of such sale pay first the expenses of this Trust  
 then the respective debts which the said Cooper shall be indebted to his said wards  
 and the surplus if any to the said Cooper or his Order. And the said Cooper  
 covenants with the said Mason that he shall have a good title to the said property  
 for the purposes aforesaid. And the said <sup>Mason</sup> covenants that he will well and  
 faithfully execute the said Trust. And the said Brown and Harris  
 covenants that they will release the said property whenever they are released and

 hereby acknowledged as well as for the further and better use of the said Allen Bradshaw and  
 Fannella his wife being justly indebted unto the said Matthew Williams in the full and  
 full sum of Seventy Eight Dollars and 36 cents lawfully money of Virginia which  
 the said Allen Bradshaw and Fannella his wife is owing more especially to have
