before the undersigned and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
I have bargained and sold unto by these presents to Henry Parsons and all his heirs and assigns the said
Henry Parsons all my interest in the negroes, Mary, Henry, Maria, and
Charlotte, who are together with all my interest in the estate of my deceased
father, Parham A. Wetmore of what nature or kind without exception including the
amount of debt which is said to be due from David A. Wetmore the said Henry Parsons
shall (abolishing) at the same time the said Henry Parsons from all the costs which
I have incurred by a suit now depending in the Chancery Court of the County of
the said Henry Parsons and his heirs forever free from the claim or claims
of him the said George A. Wetmore and all his long person or persons whatsoever
shall will and do mandamus for ever defend by their presents In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day of June 1829.
