French Indenture

This Indenture made this 19th of July 1829 between John Summer of the first part and Samuel P. French of the second part and Joseph Murdaugh of the third part witness that John Summer in a suit of 1829 against John French for about fifty dollars and the said John French being anxious to indemnify and discharge from all debt whatever the said Joseph Murdaugh in consideration of these presents as well as for the sum of one dollar in hand to him paid at or before the making and delivery of these presents said bargain and grant and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Samuel P. French his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit one Mahogany Case worth about 10 dollars and a Mahogany Case worth about 20 dollars. Notwithstanding that if the said John Summer should fail to attend as the Law requires and the said Joseph Murdaugh have to pay the said sum of about fifty dollars due by the said John Summer then the said Samuel P. French shall be bound to sell the said property having advertised it a reasonable time and apply it to the payment of the money advanced by Mr. Joseph Murdaugh the Remainder to go to Mr. Summer this Indenture
