This Indenture made this 11th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine between John Boyle and his wife Catherine of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and Littellbury Mason of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Boyle and Catherine his wife for and in consideration of the sum of four thousand four hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Littellbury Mason at and before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said John Boyle and Catherine his wife doth hereby acknowledge and forever acquit and discharge the said Littellbury Mason of all the same said goods and chattels and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien convey and confirm and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien convey and confirm unto the said Littellbury Mason his heirs and assigns one tract or parcel of land lying in Mecklenburg River on the north side which place known here containing by Estimation Eight hundred and thirty and 7/8 acres more or less lying in the County of Southampton and Southampton with Parsons and bounded by the lands of Littellbury Mason William Phillips the heirs of Richard Plant and Quinn Boyle To have and to hold the above said tract of land with all the profits appertaining and issue and all and singular the above named things belonging or in anywise appertaining to him the said Littellbury Mason his heirs and assigns forever in fee To have and to hold free from all Incumbrances and in and to the said John Boyle and Catherine his wife for them their heirs Executors Administrators doth hereby covenant and agree with the said Littellbury Mason that they
