hundred and twenty nine between Willis Eley of Southampton County of the one part and
Peter Summell of the said County of the other part witnesseth that the said Willis Eley
for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to him in hand paid or to be
paid by the said Peter Summell before the execution and delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained and sold and by these presents
do hereby bargain and sell unto the said Peter Summell his heirs and assigns a certain
parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by an old survey two
hundred and forty acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of the said Peter
Summell on the south by the common run of a brook or swamp on the west by the lands
of Septe Stephenson on the north and the lands of Isham Jordan on the east where
the tract of land called Brykin's old store which said lands was purchased by Benjamin
Drew by Mervt M Eley dec^d and by him granted to Willis Eley in his will together with
all and singular appurtenances therunto belonging as they were at the death of the said
Mervt M Eley and the succession and reversion remainder and commandments yearly annuities
rents issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold
the said land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other inheritances
therein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel
thereof with every of their right members and appurtenances unto the said Peter Sum-
mell his heirs and assigns forever and the said Willis Eley for himself and his heirs and
trustees of lands with all and singular the premises and appurtenances as they were at the
time of his death the day and year first above written

This Indenture made and executed this 18th day of December in the year one thousand eight
hundred and twenty eight Between Bartholomew Lightfoot of the County of Isle of Wight and State of
Virginia of the one part and Isham Jordan of the County of Isle of Wight and State of Virginia
Whereas Charles Steen and Nancy his wife late of the said County of Isle of Wight were
to secure and provide for the payment of the sum of five hundred and Eighty dollars and twenty
three cents due to the said Joseph Atkinson on the ninth day of November
one thousand Eight hundred and twenty seven by an Indenture bearing date the 8th day
November 1827 and admits to record in the County Court of Southampton the 8th day
of December 1827 convey'd to the said Bartholomew Lightfoot one certain tract of land
of land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by survey
One hundred and Eighty seven acres more or less which said tract or parcel of land
belonged to William Brykin dec^d and is a part of that tract or parcel of land which was
bequeathed by the last will and testament of the said William Brykin dec^d to his daughter
daughter Polly Drew Elizabeth Drew and Nancy Drew and by and under a decree of the
Court of Southampton County the said tract of land hundred and Eighty seven acres
more or less was allotted and apportioned over to Nancy Drew who afterward informed
