One piece called the first place containing five and three quarter acres. one other piece adjoining the said first estimated at fifty acres commencing at the said first tract in a point and running down to a new marked line the said land is bounded on the north by the lands of the said Samuel Drury on the west by the same on the east by the same on the south by the lands of Joseph Drury and Stephen Drury's which the said land the said Samuel Drury has won in possession to have and to hold and enjoy and singular the said land improvements and benefits thence belonging unto the said Samuel Drury to his heirs and assigns forever. which said land I the said Stephen Drury do warrant and for ever defend the right title and interest against the claim of every person or persons whatsoever of all and sing elsewhere. The said land with all the improvements and benefits thence belonging I the said Stephen Drury have put the said Samuel Drury in full possession by delivering to him the said Land and improvements. Norrell Trustee of the second part and Lewis Norrell of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesseth that whereas the said Thomas Chitty stands jointly indebted unto the said Lewis Norrell by Bond bearing even date with these presents for the sum of Forty one dollars. Eighty and 7/10 cents and the said Thomas Chitty being unwilling and desirous to secure the payment thereof with the interest accruing thereon unto him the said Lewis Norrell his heirs or assigns I do hereby and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Thomas N. B. Norrell Trustee at and before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged I grant bargain sell and by these presents do hereby grant bargain and sell unto him the said Thomas Norrell his heirs and assigns and administrators the following personal property to wit: One pair horse bridle and saddle two plough frames three ploughs two iron chains one wagon one loom and harness four sitting chairs two iron tables two iron beds one carved trunk one dressing glass two oak Stands one pine stove one wooden bed and bed one iron pot one iron skillet one frying pan one iron shovel one iron two water pails one bigger two bread trays one griddle and one. One pair iron axes two grubshoes four weedmashers one spinning wheel and one pair cast iron one pair iron wedges one pair cast wheels two barrels fourhead of sheep and one chest one iron hot rack one pair iron traces.
