executors &c that he will by these presents warrant and forever defend the right and title of the
aforesaid personal property hereby conveyed against the claims or demands of all and every
person or persons what so ever to and for the following intents and purposes that is to say
upon special trust nevertheless now provided the said Thomas Blitby or his repres-
entatives shall pay or cause to be paid unto the said Davis Morell his heirs or assigns
the aforesaid sum of Sixty one dollars eighty 80 cents and the interest thereon accruing
together with the costs attending these presents on or before the 25th day of December
1839. In which Indenture is to be void and of none effect but if otherwise the said
Thomas B. Morell, trustee or his legal representatives whom he or they shall be then
requested by either the said Thomas Blitby or Davis Morell or either of their legal
representatives shall advertise the time and place of sale by advertisements posted
up at two or more public places in the neighborhood for at least ten days previous
to the day of sale and shall sell at public auction to the highest bidder for
ready money all or so much of the aforesaid property hereby conveyed as may
be sufficient to pay and satisfy the aforesaid debt and interest accruing thereto
all costs attending the execution of these presents and to complete my payment

and premises thenceforth the said Elizabeth Broth his heirs executors &c for ever against
the claim of him the said George Ewan ~~and executors~~ and against the claim or claim
of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever
