This Indenture made this 17th day of August one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine
between Benjamin Wester of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part
and James Scott of the same County and State of the second part and Joseph Petton of the County
of Southampton and State of Virginia aforesaid of the third part witnesseth that whereas
the said Benjamin Wester stands justly indebted by a note of hand to the said James Scott
in the sum of Sixty four dollars and Sixty two cents Current money of the United States
of America and wherfor the further sume of the payment it is agreed by the parties
herein that a conveyance in Trust shall be made unto the said Joseph Petton for the benefit of
the said James Scott if the sum on the note aforesaid shall not be punctually paid
with lawful interest thereon on or before the first day of December next A.D. 1839 This Indenture
doth further declare that the said Benjamin Wester for and in consideration of the premises and for the better
discharge of the said sum of one dollar av to him in hand paid the receipt of which is acknowledged and shall be given
and held and by these presents doth for himself his heirs Executors and Administrators give grant
bargain and sell unto the said Joseph Petton his heirs and Assignees for ever
with all their increase two feather Beds and furniture one chistern^o wheel and three hair
Cards 1 quarter dish and half dozen spoons 2 iron pots and forks each 8 hours 1 bushel of
Flour and to hold the aforesaid granted and bargained premises unto the said Joseph
Petton his heirs and assigns in trust forever and it is hereby declared that the two intent meanings of this
present is that if the said Benjamin Wester shall punctually pay to the said James Scott his heirs
affids the said sum of Sixteen dollars and Sixty two cents and interest agreeable to the terms of
the said Note to the said James Scott then the said Joseph Petton his heirs and Assignees
hold the property above granted to the sole and proper use and behoof of the said Benjamin Wester
