now residents that the said John Barnes his heirs, Executors administrators and assigns shall permit the said Indiana Obligor to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said negro slaves and take the profits thereof to her own use until default shall be made in the payment of the said sum of Four hundred and fifteen dollars either in the whole or in part and then upon their further default after the happening of such default of payment as the said John Barnes or his heirs administrators or assigns shall request be it the said negro slaves John Shepherd and Alchet or each of them as the trustee or his representatives duly authorized to act shall think sufficient for the purpose aforesaid shall sell to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction after having fixed the time and place of sale at his own discretion and giving at least ten days notice without day advertisement at the front door of the Court House of Washington County on some Court day previous to the day of sale and out of the money arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the premises pay to the said Theron Lee his heirs Executors administrators or assigns the sum of Four hundred and fifteen dollars with the interest which may thereon lawfully have accrued and the balance if any shall pay to the said Indiana Obligor his heirs Executors administrators and assigns. But if the whole of the said sum of Four hundred and fifteen dollars with the interest accruing thereon shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said Theron Lee his heirs Executors administrators and assigns on or before the 25th day of December 1829 when the same is payable with the interest thereon agreeable to the Bonds herein before named so that no default be made of payment of the said sum of Four hundred and fifteen dollars and interest thereon then this Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue. of the sum of Ten hundred and seven dollars which said Sum is due from the said
Sept^r & Summers to the said John Wythe by Bond bearing date the 8th day
of September 1829 as also for and in consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid by
the said Wythe the receipt whereof the said Sept^r & Summers doth hereby acknow-
ledge hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell
convey and make over unto the said Shadrach Wythe and his heirs forever all his right and
