Webb fail to pay to the said Cornelius Williams his heirs Executors or Administrators aforesaid sum of Thirty one dollars with all interest accruing thereon and all costs aforesaid on or before the said first day of November next then and in that case it shall be lawful for the said Edwin Williams his heirs Executor or Admin. to take reasonable and just possession of the said Bed and Furniture wheresoever or in whose possession found and after giving reasonable notice of the time and place of Sale expose the said bed to sale to the highest bidder for Cash and out of the proceeds of such sale first pay and satisfy all reasonable expenses of these presents and all expenses attending the said Sale and the balance apply toward the payment of the aforesaid debt and interest and the surplus if any pay over to the said John M. Now allmen by these presents that we George G. Gray and William Pickers are fully and firmly bound unto William B. Giles Esq. Governor of Chief Magistrate of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the just and full sum of One thousand dollars to which payment we will and truly to be made to the said Governor and his successor we bind ourselves on his Executor and Administrator jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated the 21<sup>st</sup> day of September 1829 The condition of the above obligation is such that whenever the above bound George G. Gray hath been duly appointed Commissioner of the Revenue on the Parish of Nottonay in the County of Southampton for the ensuing twelve months & Mr. therefore if the said George G. Gray shall well and truly perform all the duties required of him as Commissioner aforesaid according to Law then this obligation to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue
