attorney for Pittston Prince of the one part and Joel Prince of the other part both of the
County of Southampton Witnesses that the said William Prince as attorney aforesaid
for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars law full money of Virginia
him in hand paid the receipt whereof the said William Prince doth hereby acknowledge
the 15th day of August 1829 hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell
and convey unto the said Joel Prince his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land
it being his the said Pittston's undivided interest or portion of his father's land now
in possession of Elizabeth Porter as her dower from the Estate of his former husband the
Prince dec'd. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land or his proportion
of said dower at the death of the said Elizabeth Porter with the appurtenances thereto
belonging to him the said Joel Prince his heirs and assigns forever and the said William
Prince for himself his heirs Executor and Administrator doth hereby covenant and agree
to and with the said Joel Prince his heirs and assigns that the said William
Prince attorney aforesaid and his heirs the said tract or undivided interest in the
same with its appurtenances unto him the said Joel Prince his heirs and assigns against
him the said William Prince attorney for the said Pittston Prince and his heirs and against
all persons whatsoever shall will and do as an antient law doth defend In Witness
