Examined and do<sup>r</sup> for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars lawful money of Virginia  
to pd Prince him or his heirs paid the receipt whereof the said William Prince doth hereby acknowledge  
the 15<sup>th</sup> day of August 1829 doth fully grant bargains and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell  
and convey unto the said Joel Prince his heirs and assigns a certain tract of land  
it being in the said Littleton's an acre or interest or portion of his father's land now  
in possession of Elizabeth Porter a widow from the Estate of her former husband John  
Prince dec<sup>d</sup>. To have and to hold the said tract of Land in his proportion  
of said donor at the south of the said Elizabeth Porter with the appurtenances thereto  
belonging to him the said Joel Prince his heirs and assigns forever and the said William  
Prince for himself his heirs Executors and Administrators doth hereby covenant and agree  
to and with the said Joel Prince his heirs and assigns that the said William  
Prince Attorney aforesaid and his heirs the said tract or undivided interest in the  
same with its appurtenances unto him the said Joel Prince his heirs and assigns against  
him the said William Prince attorney for the said Littleton Prince and his heirs except  
all persons whatsoever shall will and do warrant and garnish defend *W.M. Prince*  
whence the said William Prince hath granted it his hand and seal the day of date above written

other part Whereas by an interlocutory decree made and entered in the County Court  
of Southampton the 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 1828 in a cause lately depending in said Court  
between Benjamin H. Stiles in right of his wife Mary and Charlotte O. Holland  
Plaintiff and Deborah H. Holland an infant daughter of Isaac & Abby and her  
defendants It was decreed and ordered that William M. Stiles after giving twenty days  
notice of the time and place of sale should expose to public Auction upon a crest of four  
months the several trees or parcels of land one in Southampton County Virginia  
and the other in Salmonton County Virginia the two mentioned of which is land
