

On the 1st day of October 1829, between Benjamin Jones and wife, of Southampton County, Virginia, on the one part, and John Brown, of the same county and state, on the other part, did make and enter into the following indenture, witnesseth:

That the said Benjamin Jones and wife doth grant and sell to the said John Brown, his heirs and assigns, for ever, all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereto belonging, lying and being in the County of Southampton, to wit, a tract or parcel of land containing by estimation One hundred and forty acres more or less adjoining the lands of Enoch Shanks on the east that belong to the heirs of Peter Moon on the south, and bounded on the north by the lands of George Parker on the west, and bounded by Blackwater River being exposed to sale at the same time and place notice thereof having been given twenty days previous thereto, in conformity to law, whereupon when Wiley M. Jenkins became the highest bidder and purchaser of said tract, parcel of land, for the sum of Three hundred and five dollars and fifty cents, and whereupon by a final decree pronounced by the said Court of Southampton on the 11th day of January 1828, upon a report returned and filed in the said Court on the 12th day of November 1827, to which no exception was over filed it was further decreed and ordered that the land from thenceforth reported in the said Court, made to the said John and wife without warranty, This Indenture therefore witnesseth that the said William M. Jones and wife doth grant and sell to the said Wiley M. Jenkins the right or interest having acknowledged, hath granted bargained sold alined and confirmed unto him by this instrument grant bargain and aline and confirm the said lands before mentioned and described, as old town Lucy in the parish of Southampton and which was sold at public auction as aforesaid to him to hold the said tract or parcel of land in the said County of Southampton with the town house thereon and all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereto before mentioned unto the said Wiley M. Jenkins his heirs and assigns for ever against the claim or claims made or demand of himself said William M. Jones, his heirs or assigns or either of them, and that the said William M. Jones for himself and his heirs the said tract and parcel of land with all the rights the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Wiley M. Jenkins his heirs and assigns doth warrant and defend by virtue of the aforesaid decree and now and then, Notwithstanding the said William M. Jones hath premises within his house and land, the aforesaid year as first above written.
