Henry Newson his Executor executors takers and assigns all my interest in the sum total of  
my Mother in Law Elizabeth Jones of Brunswick County including the negroes together  
with their increase which were left to her the said Elizabeth by her will and by will of my father  
Sam'l Barnes one with all and singular the several rights to which I am entitled by said will  
of what nature so ever without exception To have and to hold the said Henry  
Newson and his heirs forever against the claim or claim of all and every person or persons who ever  
shall and will warrant and cause defend by these presents In witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of April one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine

Thos. Indenture made this 28<sup>th</sup> day of February 1829 between Thomas E. Porter  
Patrick Ford and Benjamin Branch tripartite all of the County of Southampton Wm. Pitt  
that the said Thomas E. Porter for and in consideration of one dollar to him on hand hereby the  
said Patrick Ford doth receipt whereof the said Thomas E. Porter do hereby acknowledge  
have granted bargained and sold and made over to the said Patrick Ford and by the said parties doth  
grant bargain sell and make over to said Ford as his in the following property (viz) two  
brather beds and furniture two pine chest two pine tables half dozen dining chairs two iron  
pots one oven skilled and spuds two axes two hoes and all the crockery ware of every descrip-  
tion one spinning wheel stand and tonge one com and two scrop. To have and to hold the  
aforementioned property unto the said Patrick Ford his heirs and assigns forever and the said  
Thomas E. Porter for himself his heirs and assigns forever to the said Patrick  
Ford does shall and will warrant and cause defend upon said instrument that whereas  
the said Thomas E. Porter stands bound and acknowledging himself greatly indebted to  
the said Benjamin Branch in and for the just sum of forty eight dollars agreeable to  
a note where the said Porter has assigned to the said Branch bearing date say and  
date above written and the said Patrick Ford shall cause after being notified by said  
Branch or Porter shall tell or cause to be told so much of the aforesaid property as will  
be sufficient to discharge the above mentioned debt of forty eight dollars and interest  
thereon and necessary expenses The date aforesaid to be made upon the request of Thomas  
E. Porter or said Benjamin Branch giving by advertisement ten days notice of the time and  
place of the sale date and the said Patrick Ford shall pay unto the said Thomas E. Porter  
after the sale the balance if any after paying the aforesaid debt and necessary
