This Indenture made the 5<sup>th</sup> day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty six between Stephen Andrews of the County of Southampton of the one part and Anthony Andrews of the same County of the other part. Whereas it is agreed between the said Stephen Andrews for and in consideration of the sum of twenty four dollars good and lawful money of Virginia then in hand paid by the said Anthony Andrews the receipt whereof the said Stephen Andrews doth acknowledge himself fully and amply satisfied and has his seal put unto the same and sold a certain orchard and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Anthony Andrews his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract of land of land and premises situated lying and being in the County aforesaid containing by estimation eight acres more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at the first corner tree at the turn of ready hole & branch thence running southwardly a line of marked trees to a red oak a corner tree in Thomas Washington's line down Misty and along a line of new marked trees to the south prong of said branch then down said branch to the beginning neglecting with all houses out builded thereon buildings yards gardens or chores may waters and water courses whatsoever may or may not be appertaining thereto. To have and to hold the said land in fee simple to him and to his heirs forever. And the said Stephen Andrews for himself his wife doth by these presents Covenant and grants and will the said Anthony Andrews his heirs and assigns that he will by these presents warrant and forever defend against all title claim or demand of any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part thereof.
