This Indenture made the 3rd day of September in the year of our Lord 1829 between
 Mary Cland of the first part &c. Son to Turner of the third part &
 Stephen Murdough of the fourth part &c. Son to Turner of the third part &c.
 Whereas Mr. Murdough had whilas George Ivy and John C. Turner having become acquainted
 with Mary Cland on a bond executed by the said Mary Cland to said
 Hammett Sheriff and Committee of the Estate of William Cland dec'd for the sum of
 hundred and eighty four dollars bearing date with these presents and the said Mary Cland
 being willing and desirous of saving the said George Ivy and John C. Turner
 harmless and free from all damage or damage and cost and for the further consideration
 of one dollar in hand paid to the said Mary Cland at and before the sealing and
 delivery of these presents do bargains sell release and confirm and let over to Stephen
 Murdough who is mutually chosen by the parties to these presents trustee three
 brother beds and furniture one such bed to make up stock of all kind and the
 increase of said stock which the said Mary Cland pur chased at the sale of William
 Cland dec'd and the said Mary Cland for herself her heirs exec ad'm and assigns do
 further more bargain sell Confirm and let over all the right interest & profit that
 may be due as creditor and debtors of William Cland dec'd both in the real and
 personal Estate of the said William Cland To have and to hold the before
 mentioned personal and real Estate by the said Mary Cland bargained and sold
 or intended to be bargained and sold to the said Stephen Murdough his executors
 or assigns upon this further trust that if the said Mary Cland shall die and
 truly faithfully and punctually pay off the debts before mentioned with interest
 and all costs that may accrue on or before the tenth day of June 1830 or shall
 not attempt to do that of any of the property aforesaid and in the event of such
 disposition happening or intended to happen then in that case the said Stephen
 Murdough by the request of either of the parties before mentioned shall take such
 steps as may be necessary to reduce and secure said property in his possession
 until default of the payment of the debt aforesaid then in that case the said
 Stephen Murdough by the request of either of the parties shall sell at public sale
 after giving reasonable notice of the time and place of sale and out of the proceeds
 of such sale pay off the aforesaid debt and interest and all costs attending the sale
 of such property and the balance if any pay over to the said Mary Cland or such
 person or persons as may be by her in writing appointed to receive the same
 on that case this Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue
 ever undiminished day and year past before mentioned.
