Draper vs. Indenture made this 26th day of October with the Seal of our Lord 1829 between the said the Doctor Benjamin Giffen and his and Henry Harris and his of the County of Southampton State of Virginia Whereas the said Elias Draper is partly indebted to the said Henry Harris in the sum of Forty five dollars of lawful money of Virginia to be paid twelve months after date as by Bond bearing date the twenty first day of October last but not delivered until twelve months had expired which will more fully appear which debt will be in full payment from that date the said Elias Draper is willing and desirous to secure the said Indenture with the sum of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said Elias Draper in full paid by the said Benjamin Giffen and his at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged hath been granted bargained and sold (released and confirmed) to the said Benjamin Giffen his heirs and assigns forever a certain part of his tract of land sufficient to discharge the said Debt and to be attesting the premises lying in the aforesaid County of Virginia and bounded by the lands of Thomas Shingleton and Elias Draper Alfred Windsor and Elizabeth Washburn reference to former deed bearing date the 1st day of November 1828 in which the said Elias Draper had to the said land and premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging and to the said Benjamin Giffen his heirs Executors administrators and assigns for himself his heirs Executors administrators and assigns with thereby covenant promise and agree to and with the said Benjamin Giffen his heirs Executors administrators and assigns that he will by the presents warrant and forever defend the right and title of the said piece or parcel of Land and premises and every part and parcel thereof against the claims or demands of all and every person or persons whatsoever.
