Joyner in consideration of the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars and fifty six Cents of lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said John Nicholson at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. Have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said John Nicholson his heirs and assigns forever all his right title and interest of him the said Joseph P. Joyner in the tract of land whereon John Fitzhugh formerly laid containing one thousand and forty seven acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows. Beginning at a red oak corner in the line of Barron's and John Henry Fitzhugh's line thence along Barron's line to Barron's to the beginning this land being the donor of Mrs. Nancy Fitzhugh with whom the said Joseph P. Joyner is intermarried and the said Joseph P. Joyner for himself and his heirs with all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John Nicholson his heirs and assigns free from the claims or claims of all persons whatsoever as warrant and defend by these presents. Joyner in the tract of land lying in the aforesaid County and State formerly belonged to John Fitzhugh containing twenty nine acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows. Beginning at a corner in Lewis Waller's line thence along Waller's line thence along Barron's thence along Turner's thence along Turner's to John H. Fitzhugh's pt or to the beginning this land being the donor of Mrs. Nancy Fitzhugh with whom the said Joseph P. Joyner is intermarried and the said Joseph P.
