Daime and her three children Marwellly and a young child one bed and furnitures wch
of Cew and Cart and wheels one gray horse one horse cart and whie two bulleas and all
other propertie of every description or kind now or in my possession and likewise such other
propertie as I may have belonging to me and the summes in case of the death of the
said slaves to have and to hold the aforesaid slaves and the future increase of the
same the rof and all the other personal propertie hereby named unto the said
Nicholas St. Cocke his heirs and administrators and assigns forever to the only profitor
use and behoef of the said nicholas St. Cocke his heirs Executrix Administratrix and
assigns forever to the only profour and behoef of the said nicholas St. Cocke his heirs
moans executors and assigns forever and the said nicholas St. Cocke heraffed
his heirs Executrix and Administratrix and assignes forever in manner and form following
that is to say that the said nicholas St. Cocke his heirs Executrix Administratrix shall affoyd
slaves and the future increase of the personalty thereof and all the other personal propertie hereby
Conveyed unto the said nicholas St. Cocke his heirs Executrix Administratrix and assignes
against all persons whatever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these
presentes upon Trust. Notwithsthdg that the said nicholas St. Cocke his heirs executors
and assigns shall permit the said nicholas St. Cocke to remain in quiet and peaceable possesion
of the aforesaid slaves and other propertie hereby Conveyed and take the profits thereof
own use until default be made in the payment of the said sum of Four hundred
Dollars and also what other debts may be hereafter contracted by the said Cocke
with the said Gordon either in the whole or in part and in whom his further
trust that the his heirs executors and assignes shall and will do soon after the happening
of such default of payment as the his heirs executors and assignes may think proper or
the said Robert Gordon his executors and assignes shall require to sell the aforesaid
negros and the increase of such negros thereof and all other propertie of every kind
hereby Conveyed or intended to be Conveyed or such part as the trust or his representatives
hereby authorized to act shall think sufficient for the importe and shall chuse to prefer
to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at publick auction after having
fixed the time and place of sale at their own discretion and quin fifties dayes notice
