This Indenture made this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of November 1828 between William Giffen and wife Virginia of the County of Southampton and Parish of Netley of the one part and John Rock of the same County and Parish of the other part witnesseth that the said William Giffen and wife for and in Consideration of the sum of Thre Pounds and twenty eight dollars and 75 Cents good and Lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said John Rock the receipt whereof the said William Giffen and wife Roger in full satisfaction thereto doth fully and completely satisfy and discharge all unto the said John Rock our certain tract of Land and premises situate and lying in the County aforesaid containing by a late survey one hundred and one acres being the same more or less and bounded as followeth Beginning at a corner a stone in Black Creek Swamp to a corner in the said swamp A. E. thence a line of marked trees A. N. to the Head of Little Pond and the said Giffen to the head thereof up the said head pond to a corner a stone thereon forth a line of marked trees to the Beginning together with all the houses edifices and improvements ways water and water courses whetsoever belonging or in any way appertaining to have and to hold said lands to him the said John Rock to him and his heirs forever and the said William Giffen and wife for themselves their heirs and by these presents covenant and grant unto the said John Rock and his heirs and affees that he the said William Giffen and wife Virginia will warrant and forever defend all right titles or claims or demands of any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part or parcel thereof. IN WITNESS whereof the said William Giffen and wife Virginia have hereunto set their hands and seals this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of November 1828.
