 one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine witnesses William L. Rochelle James
 Barham and Barham Wrenn Commissioners appointed by the County Board of South-
 ampton to sell the lands belonging to Lucy Maurice of the one part and George Barker
 of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that we the said Commis-
 sioners for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred and fifty dollars to us in hand
 paid paid by the said Peter Barker the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 we the said Commissioners have bargained granted and sold and by these presents do grant
 bargain and sell unto the said Peter Barker to him and his heirs forever one certain
 tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County above written contain-
 Eighty acres more or less and bounded as follows beginning at a Gum at the corner of the
 Placemont Swamp in Blows Mill Pond a corner of William L. Rochelle line
 thence Southward along the said Rochelle's line to a pine a corner thence Eastward
 along the said Rochelle line to a branch thence along a chopped line in the branch
 to a maple a corner on the said Rochelle line thence Westward to a pine in a
 small branch a corner in the said Rochelle line thence along the said branch to the
 run of the Mill Pond thence up the Mill Pond to the beginning To Have and
 to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with all the appurtenances thereto
 belonging unto the said Peter Barker to be held by him and his heirs forever and
 we the said Commissioners for ourselves and our heirs and all and every person or persons
 whosoever claiming under them shall and well warrant and forever defend as far as
