Dick and the said Thomas Brown being desirous to secure to the said Dorothy A. Dick the use and enjoyment of any property to which she is or may be entitled against the right which would otherwise accrue to the said Thomas by virtue of the said marriage as also to prevent her being deprived of the same or any part thereof by means of any debt which the said Thomas may have contracted or may contract At or this present Witnesseth that the said Dorothy A. Dick for and in consideration of the premises as aforesaid and in the further consideration of one dollar to her in hand paid by the said John Dick and Benjamin Griffen hath given granted bargain and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell unto the said John Dick and Benjamin Griffen all the property of which she is at present possessed or to which she is or may be entitled hereafter either under the Estate of Robert Malcolm dec'd or to the same law money or other personal or real property or Estate which she may derive by gift from the said Robert Malcolm (Widow) in his lifetime to which she may become entitled at her death as the same may devolve by gift or distribution and all other property which she may hereafter become entitled to in any way whatsoever hereby granting to the before mentioned John Dick and Benjamin Griffen full power to sell and convey the same to him and his heirs forever upon this Special Trust and confidence whereto after expressed And the said Thomas Brown as well in
