profits thereof for and during their joint lives retaining in themselves the right and the
and so far as he thinks proper the disposal of the same and that if the said Dorothy
A. Towne survives the said Thomas that he will convey to her all rights which he
derives under this deed and that if the said Dorothy should die leaving the said Thomas
that he will convey the same to her husband Paul. whatever or they may be under the
said Dorothy N. shall during her lifetime have Transfused of interdict bequeathed jewelry
or appointed chesamead in manner aforesaid after provision for her. It is hereby
covenanted and agreed by and between all the parties hereunto that the said Dorothy
shall at all and any time have full and ample power and authority wherupon she may desire
to give grant and Convey the same or any part thereof either such as at this time belonging
her or in the said John Pick and Benjamin Griffon by virtue of this deed or which may
hereafter in like manner vest to any person or persons whomsoever according to her own
will and pleasure by her Dead signed sealed and delivered according to Law over falsehood
So as to the whole or any part thereof to devise and bequeath the balance or the whole as the case
may be or in any part thereof in like manner by her will duly authenticated which
such deed or deeds or will shall be as valid as if agreed to and made by all the parties
Contracting and it is further covenanted between the parties that should the said
John Pick and Benjamin Griffon die any part of the aforesaid First covenant
unexecuted that the same is not to pass to his representatives real or personal
but to be completed and fulfilled by some fit and proper person recommended by the
said Dorothy A. Pick or her friends device leaving him or distribute his or they as the
case may be and approved of by the Court of the County in which he shall be lying
at the time residere and by such Court appointed to act as such In Testimony
