This Indenture made and entered into this 18th day of January 1830 in and between
 Jesse G. Darden of the first part William & Lawrence of the second and James H. Murphy of the
 third part all of Southampton County and State of Virginia Witnesseth that the said
 Jesse G. Darden stands properly indebted unto the said James H. Murphy in the sum of
 One hundred and seventy dollars and 75 Cts. lawful money of Virginia which appears by the
 bearing date with these presents with Interest from the date hereof from the said Jesse G.
 Darden being desirous to indemnify and secure to himself the said James H. Murphy the payment
 thereof but more especially for the sum of dollars to him or to his heirs paid by him the said
 Jesse G. Darden before the entering and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged that the said Jesse G. Darden hath granted bargained sold
 and doth by these presents grant bargain and sell to him the said William & Lawrence
 his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County
 of Southampton and in the lower district of Nottingham parish containing 8 1/2 acres more or less
 and bounded by the lands of Jesse Darden and others it being the land on which the said Jesse
 G. Darden lives Crop of all kinds two head of black and four white two pots three head of cattle
 one mare and colt one cart and wheels all my household furniture iron tools household and
 Kitchen furniture To have and to hold With all the rights and privileges of the
 before mentioned property to him the said William & Lawrence his heirs Executors assigns
 forever and the said Jesse G. Darden doth for himself his heirs Executors assigns
 warrant and Will forever defend all right title claims and Interest to the before men-
 tioned property to him the said William & Lawrence his heirs and assigns forever upon the
 following trust Viz that of the said Jesse G. Darden shall pay and discharge
 the above debt with all cost pertaining to this trust then it shall be lawful and right so long
 as required in writing from under the hand of the said James H. Murphy his heirs or assigns
 to set up and sell to the highest bidder for Cash the before mentioned property after giving
 notice by advertisement at least ten days previous to the day of sale and out of the proceeds
 pay the debt and cost and the surplus of any pay over to the said Jesse G. Darden his heirs or
 assigns In Witness whereof we the parties have set our hands and seals this day and date

This Indenture made this 18th day of January in the Year 1830 between John Nicholson of
 the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Henry P. Nicholson of the same County
 and State of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Nicholson in consideration of one
 hundred dollars of lawful money of Virginia to him or to his heirs paid by the said Henry P. Nicholson
 at or before the entering and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Henry P. Nicholson
 his heirs and assigns forever all the right title and interest of him the said John Nicholson
 in the tract of land wherein John Fitzhugh formerly lived containing One hundred and forty
 seven acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows beginning at a red oak corner in
 Newt's Bluffs and John Fitzhugh line thence along John Fitzhugh's line to James
 Lee Waller's thence along Waller's line to Henry Cannon's line thence along Cannon's line to James
 to the beginning this land being the donor of Mr. Parney Fitzhugh with whom bought
