This Indenture made and entered into on the 1st day of May in the Year of our Lord 1829
Between Charles Bryant and Temperance Bryant his wife of the County of Suffolk and
State of Virginia of the one part and Everett Bryant of the same County and State of the other part
Witnesseth that the said Charles Bryant and Temperance his wife for and consideration
of the sum of Two hundred dollars current money of this Commonwealth to them paid
by the said Everett Bryant at or before the ensaing and delivery of these presents the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents they and
each of them doth grant bargain and sell alien enfeoff and Confirm unto the said Everett
Bryant his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land situate by my and
lying in the aforesaid County of Suffolk and Parish of Saint Luke containing
a recent survey twenty three acres the same more or less and bounded as followeth
Beginning at a white oak standing Williamson's line a corner for said Charles Bryant
thence along said Charles Bryant's line at 54^{ft}. 11 1/2 poles to a black Elm standing in
the Aaron's branch a corner for said Charles Bryant in Taylor's line thence along said
Taylor's line to Blund's line thence along said Blund's line to a large white oak a corner for Cok's
land thence along Cook's line of marked trees to a large Water oak Williamson's corner
thence along said Williamson's line to the beginning again with all right title in either
claim or demand of me and to the said tract or parcel of Land and premises with all appur-
tenances thereto belonging or in any case appertaining To have And to hold the above
described tract or parcel of Land and premises with all and singular its appurtenances
thereunto belonging unto him the said Everett Bryant his heirs and assigns forever to have for the
only proper use and behoof of him the said Everett Bryant his heirs and assigns and the said
Charles Bryant and Temperance his wife for themselves their heirs and assigns to have and
use of them both by these presents covenant and agree to and with the said Everett Bryant his heirs
and assigns that they will fully warrant and forever defend the right and title of the
aforesaid tract or parcel of Land and premises and every part or part thereof against the claim
or demands of all and every person or persons whatsoever. In witness whereof the said Charles
Bryant and Temperance his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the
