This Indenture made and entered into on the day of October 27th in the year of our Lord's 1833 between Lewis Williams of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and Emachan Bottle of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Lewis Williams for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and seventy seven dollars current money of the Commonwealth of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Emachan Bottle at or before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted bargained and sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell, alien, convey and confirm unto him the said Emachan Bottle his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of St. Luke's containing by a late survey bearing Eight and two thirds acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows, to wit: Beginning at a certain Stand in the St. Carolines line at the run of the deep branch a corner for the land of Bowers Peale dec'd thence along said St. Carolines line E 34 poles thence S 89° 6' 1/2" thence N 89° 6' 1/2" poles thence N 88° 6' 13" to the center of two poplars and a pine standing in the said St. Carolines line at the run of a small branch a new corner for said Lewis Williams and Jonathan Bottle thence along a new line of marked trees N 12° 44' 13" poles to a post standing in Samuel Williams line a new corner for the said parties thence along said Samuel Williams line N 75° 44' 81 poles to a ~~small~~ pine standing at the run of the Bowers dam Branch a corner thence up the run of said Branch 59 poles to the mouth of the aforesaid deep branch thence up the line of said deep Branch 100 poles to the Beginning together with all right title interest claim and demand of in and to the said tract or parcel of land and premises with in appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining to have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises with all and singular its appurtenances and thence lying unto him the said Jonathan Bottle his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Emachan Bottle his heirs and assigns and the said Lewis Williams for himself his heirs, Executors and assigns doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Emachan Bottle his heirs and assigns that he will by these presents warrant and forever defend the right and title of the aforesaid tract or parcel of land hereby conveyed and conveyed part or parcels thereof against the claims or demand of all and every person or persons whole or in whole of the said Lewis Williams which hereunto set his hand and affix his seal the day of date first within written

Nicholson in consideration of one hundred and fifty dollars of lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Henry Bottle at or before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Henry Bottle his heirs and assigns forever his interest in one certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia this land being so inclosed by the said Henry Bottle the son of John Nicholson and John Nicholson of Joseph P. Pocher and also the land being the donor of Mr. Nancy Fitzhugh with the said Joseph P. Pocher
