Witnesseth that the said Presley Barnes for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar
to him in hand paid by the said James Comerly the receipt whereof he the said Presley Barnes
hereby acknowledge and for other purposes hereafter named hath granted bargained and sold
and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said James Comerly his heirs and
assigns the following property to wit These feather beds and furniture one black mare
one Sorrel Horse two Sons and Seven pigs and there increase one man saddle and bridle all
his house furniture and Kitchen furniture all his plow and horses axes tables chairs desks
his Crop or Corn fodder and Cotton cloth wheels that may be made the present year in
the lands of John Thomas which property the said Barnes doth hereby for himself his
heirs and assigns bind himself to warrant and defend the right title and interest of the
same unto the said Comerly his heirs or assigns clear of all claims or demands of any and every
persons whatsoever nevertheless upon trust to secure the payment of a certain debt
to be the said Barnes acknowledged to be firstly due to John Troy and which he is willing
and desires to pay the said debt of Twenty dollars thirty one cents from of the said
Barnes shall pay or cause to be paid unto the said John Troy his debt aforesaid
together with interest and cost of attorney this Indenture into execution on behalf of
day of October ~~1830~~ then the above obligation to be void and of no effect therefrom to come
in full force and effect so as to authorize the said Comerly to advertise and sell the
aforesaid lands and the above named property for ready money and pay over to the said
Troy the proceeds of such sale after reserving to himself the usual commissars fees
