This Indenture made and entered this 15 day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty in and between Septiah Darden of Southampton County and State of Virginia of the first part and Sepe Parker of the same County and State of the second part, and Lemuel Daughtry of the same County and State of the third part. Witnesseth that whereas the said Septiah Darden did on the 15 day of January 1830 give a forth coming Bond to said Lemuel Daughtry for the sum of one hundred and forty nine dollars and 75 cents, and Sepe Parker became his security all of the said Septiah Darden did on the first day of August 1829 execute a Bond to the said Sepe Parker for the sum of one hundred dollars payable from the date thereof from the said Septiah Darden being desirous to indemnify and secure the above Sepe Parker for his security thereof and also the above bond due the said Sepe Parker but more especially for the sum of one dollar to him the said Septiah Darden in hands paid by the said Lemuel Daughtry before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. And that he the said Septiah Darden hath granted bargained and sold and doth by these presents grant bargain and sell to him the said Lemuel Daughtry his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit 4 feather beds and furniture 22 Head of Hogs 1 lot of sheep 1 lot of Cattle 6 Windsor Chairs 6 Bay bottom Chairs 1 Bureau 2 Black Walnut tables 1 blanket and furniture 2 pine Tables 2 iron pots 2 Dutch ovens 1 Kaff and iron skillet 3 Cast Stoves and ploughing utensils of every description 1 cutting Knife 2 axe and all farming tools of every kind 1 Corn and gear 30 barrels of Corn two thousand pounds of blade fodder 1 Horse one Gun 1 Gunstone 1 yr. of warping Bars and Boxes 1 set Fiddle 1 Baker 1 griddle 2 spinning wheels 1 saddle and bridle 1 whip saw &c. To him the said Lemuel Daughtry his heirs and assigns forever upon the following Terms to wit that if the said Septiah Darden shall fail to pay and discharge the above mentioned debts and all costs pertaining to this first it shall be lawful and right in that event for him the said Lemuel Daughtry so soon as requested in writing from him the said Sepe Parker his heirs or assigns to set up and sell for cash the above mentioned property after giving public Notice by advertisement in the neighborhood of the said Septiah Darden at least fifteen days before the day of sale and out of the money so raised first pay the above debts and all costs pertaining to this first and the overplus if any pay over to him the said Septiah Darden his heirs or assigns.
