This Indenture made and entered this 1st day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty in and between Septah Darden of Southampton County and State of Virginia of the first part and Septe Parker of the same County and State of Virginia part and Lemuel Daughtrey of the same County and State of the third part witnesseth that whereas the said Septah Darden did on the 10th day of January 1830 give a forth coming Bond to Jas Hammill his self for the sum of one hundred and forty five dollars and 85 per cent and Septe Parker became his security also the said Septah Darden did on the first day of August 1829 execute a bond to the said Septe Parker for the sum of one hundred dollars payable from the date thereof to the said Septah Darden being desirous to indemnify and secure the above Septe Parker for his security ship and also the above sum due the said Septe Parker but more especially for the sum of one dollar to him the said Septah Darden in hand paid by the said Lemuel Daughtrey before the insuring and delivery of three presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged Feb 1st 1830, that he the said Septah Darden hath granted bargained and sold and doth by these presents grant bargain and sell to him the said Lemuel Daughtrey his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit A feather bed and furniture 22 bushel of Peas 1 bushel of sheep fat 2 lbs of Cudle 6 pounds Chanc 1 flag bottom Chanc 1 Bureau 2 black Walnut tables 1 round and furniture 2 pine Tables 2 iron pots 2 dutch ovens 1 Braff and iron Skillet 2 Cart wheels and ploughing utensils of every description 1 cutting knife 2 axes and all farming tools of every kind 1 Cow and year 30 barrels of Corn two thousand pounds of blade fodder 1 horse one Gun 1 Grind stone 1 lb of Worthing Bars and Boxes 1000 Tittle broken 1 quidew 2 spinning wheels 1 saddle and bridle 1 white saw &c &c from the said Lemuel Daughtrey his heirs and assigns forever upon the following terms to wit that if the said Septah Darden shall fail to pay and discharge the above mentioned debts and all costs pertaining to this first it shall be lawful and right in that event for him the said Lemuel Daughtrey so soon as required in writing from him the said Septe Parker his heirs or assigns to distrain and sell for East the above mentioned property after giving public notice by advertisement in the neighborhood of the said Septah Darden at least fifteen days before the day of sale and out of the money so raised first pay the above debts and all costs pertaining to this first and the overset money pay over to him the said Septah Darden his heirs or assigns.
