Now all men by these presents that I Thomas Underwood of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia for and in consideration of the natural love good will and affection which I bear to my friend Thomas Newcome of the County and State aforesaid and of the sum of one thousand Dollars to me in hand paid by the said Thomas Newcome at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have given granted bargained sold and confirmed and by these presents do give grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said Thomas Newcomes the following negroes (which last mentioned negroes I have been the said Thomas Newcome is to take into his possession from the date of these presents) and the future increase of the aforesaid female negro slaves to have and to hold the aforesaid negro slaves and future increase of the aforesaid female negro slaves unto the said Thomas Newcomes and assigns forever to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Thomas Newcome and his heirs forever having and observing to the said Thomas Underwood the use and labour of all the aforesaid negro slaves (except negro slave Peter who of the said Thomas Newcome is to take into his possession as above mentioned and thenceforward to be so long and so long only as she the said Thomas Underwood may live and the said Thomas Newcome for myself my heirs the aforesaid negro slave to the said Thomas Newcome and the future increase of the aforesaid female negro slaves to the said Thomas Newcome and his heirs and assigns against me the said Thomas Underwood and my heirs and against all and every person or persons whomsoever claiming by through or under me shall and by do warrant and forever defend by these presents. This Indenture made this 19th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty between Thomas S. Davis of the one part and Henry Linn of the other part—

Witnesseth that the said Thomas S. Davis for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and twenty dollars and ninety five cents unto him in hand paid by the said Henry Linn the receipt whereof the said Thomas S. Davis doth hereby acknowledge and himself fully satisfied and paid out of the same doth by these presents acquit the said Henry Linn they the said Thomas S. Davis hath granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Henry Linn one certain tract plantation or parcel of land containing by estimation one hundred and thirty one acres more or less lying and being situate in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia homestead as follows adjoining the lands formerly John North dec^d Robert Davis Benjamin Davis Robert Stephens or being the land where I now live or with all the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining with the reverses and reverses to command and to command with fees and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said bargain promises with the appurtenances unto the said Henry Linn his heirs and assigns forever and the said Thomas S. Davis for himself his heirs Executors and assigns the said bargain promises and every part and parcel thereof with all their appurtenances clear exempt and secure from all claims or other encumbrances whatsover unto the said Henry Linn his heirs and assigns against all and every person whatsover now shall and will by these presents for ever warrant and defend.
