Mrs. Crompler made this 20<sup>th</sup> day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven  
Maria Crompler of the County of Southampton of the one part and Thomas Canning of the said  
County of that other part witnesseth that the said Maria Crompler for and in consideration  
of the sum of Fifteen dollars to her in hand paid her by the said Thomas Canning  
before the sealing and delivering hereof the receipt whereof the said Maria Crompler  
doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold and doth by these presents  
grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Canning his heirs and assigns known  
her undivided part of a tract of land containing fifty two acres being the same mannerly  
which tract of land was her mother's proportion of her father West Tyne's Land  
bounded as follows beginning at the fork of the dam Branch at Attington Brook  
then along a line of marked trees to a white oak a corner to Solomon Crompler's  
Spivey's line thence to a sassafras a corner tree to West Tyne and Solomon Crompler  
then along a line of marked trees to the said West Tyne to a sycamore a corner tree  
Attington Brook line then along of marked trees to the head of the said dam land  
And the reversion and reversions remaining and unexpired tenures and parts  
thereof and also all the Estate right title interest claim and demand whatsoever  
her the said Maria Crompler and her heirs forever of us and to the same or any part  
thereof to have and to hold the said land and premises with appurtenances thereto  
belonging unto the said Thomas Canning to his heirs and assigns to the only proportion  
whereof from the said Thomas Canning his heirs and assigns forever And the said  
Maria Crompler for her part his heirs &c doth covenant promise and agree with the said  
Thomas Canning his heirs &c by these presents that the said Maria Crompler the said  
land and premises every part and parcel thereof unto the said Thomas Canning  
his heirs &c against the lawful claim title and demands of her said Maria Crompler  
his heirs &c and all and every other person or persons claiming shall and will  
warrant and forever defend by these presents to her of the said Maria Crompler  
such tenants as my hand and affix my seal this day and year just above written
