This Indenture made and entered into this 8 day of March 1830 between Joseph Bygones of the first part James Blair of the second part and William Magee of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia West of the said William Magee at, in the month of October 1829 became the said Joseph Bygones security in a bond due to James Blair's wife also for a debt due me of a small amount and the said Joseph Bygones being willing and desiring to pay and leave to the said William Magee from any loss or damage which he may sustain from either do agree to convey to the said James Blair the following property to wit to wit a good mare named Sally all my Cow which I own have in my possession several head of hogs and hinds some black Chans Tables two Cows and some sheep and every other article which the said Joseph Bygones has or may have when the security debt becomes due or the time which I think advisable to sell to have and to hold the said property to the said James Blair his heirs and assigns and the said Joseph Bygones doth for himself heirs &c. covenant and agree to and with the parties of the second and third part their heirs and assigns to defend the right and title of the said conveyed property to the said James Blair and his heirs &c. in that behalf else and upon this Express Condition (Wiz) if the said Joseph Bygones shall wish in the time or at the expiration of Twelve months here or do pay the aforesaid James Blair the said Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue and if on the contrary the said Joseph Bygones shall fail to do the same within the time or before the aforesaid time mentioned then the said James Blair at the request of the said James Magee shall set up and sell to the highest bidder for cash on the premises the aforesaid property herein conveyed previously giving to every day justice and out of the proceeds of said sale first pay and discharge the aforesaid debts with all interest and costs thereupon accrued together with the expenses attending the Execution of this Trust and the surplus of any pay over to the said Joseph Bygones his heirs or heirs &c. and the said William Magee doth hereby agree to let the aforesaid property remain in the possession of the said Joseph Bygones until he shall think himself in danger. This Indenture made this day of June 1829 between Rice B. Bygones and Frances his wife of the one part and John B. Bygones of the other part West of the said Rice B. Bygones and Frances his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred and sixty dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed and do by these presents grant bargain alien and confirm unto the said John B. Bygones his heirs and assigns for ever one certain piece lot and parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton Virginia and on the East side of a Common old Mill Pond and being a part of the lot of Land which was allotted to the said Bygones in right of his wife Frances in the division of the lands belonging to the Estate of Lawrence Cook dec'd the boundaries whereof well more fully appear upon reference to the report of Commissioners as before recorded in the County Court of Southampton containing by Estimation one hundred and twenty five acres more or less to have and to hold and singular the said granted land and the duties there above mentioned unto the said John B. Bygones his heirs and assigns for ever and the said Rice B. Bygones and Frances his wife for themselves their heirs &c. doth further covenant and agree to and with the said John B. Bygones his heirs &c. that they will for ever warrant and defend the right title and interest of the said premises before mentioned unto the
