A Bargain and Agreement made this 19 day of December 1829 between William Newton and Barton Chitty. Whereof it is remembered that whereas the said William Newton gave a lease for term of years upon a tract of land formerly belonging to James C. Stephenson and others lying and being in the County of Southampton the 1st day of the said Barton Chitty upon these conditions that the said Chitty is to cultivate all the cleared land then belonging to the said land at this time as he thinks to the best advantage and also the said Newton is to draw one third part of the Corn blade fodder and peas made thereon and all the land which the said Barton Chitty shall clear for the first five years he the said Chitty is to have all that he makes thereon and after that one third part of the Crop of Corn blade fodder and peas that made on the said land and what land the said Chitty may clear after that time he have for the first three years all he make on it and the said Chitty is to give to said William Newton one third part of the Corn blade fodder and peas and the said Newton agreed that if he should die before the expiration of the said lease that the said Chitty is to remain upon the said land upon the said conditions until the lease expires and furthermore the said William Newton is to furnish rails and so much sawed timber as the said Barton Chitty may think proper to use about putting the building on the said land In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this 19 day of December one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine
