This Indenture made and executed this 15 day of March A.D. one thousand Eight hundred and thirty between Melcha Williams of the one part and Edward Crompter of the other part both of them of Southampton County and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that whereas the said Melcha Williams doth for and in consideration of the sum of Forty five dollars to her in hand paid at and before the making of and delivery of these presents by him the said Edward Crompter the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said Edward Crompter his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract and parcel of Land containing by survey seven and a half acres to being a part of the tract of Land wherein the said Melcha Williams now dwells And it being also a part of the tract of Land the said Melcha Williams does derive from her husband to wit Mr. Melchor being and being in the County of Southampton and in the lower part of A Thomas Parish and bounded as follows Viz. Beginning at a pine a new corner between the said Melcha Williams and Edward Crompter thence 70 ft along a new line of marked trees between the aforesaid Williams and Crompter 28 poles to like to a pine another new corner between the said M Williams & E Crompter in Meridian Holland's line thence 116 & 1/2 ft to a pine in a hollow line thence 127 & 6 along the said line 12 ft to another pine thence S 22 1/2 E along the said line 10 poles to a cross Corn in the turn of the Fox trap branch thence down the turn of the said branch the various courses thereof 57 ft to a white oak a corner between Meridian Holland's Edward Crompter and Cross thence N 31 1/2 E along the old line between Melcha Williams and Edward Crompter 10 ft to an old pine stump thence N 49 W along the said line 11 ft to a spruce pine thence N 31 1/2 W along the said line 21 ft to a dead pine thence N 35 W along the said line 11 ft to a dead oak stump thence N 8 W along the said line 19 ft to like from the beginning I have and to hold the said bargain and premises with every part and parcel thereof with all its rights privileges & advantages to the said Edward Crompter his heirs and assigns forever And the said Melcha Williams doth for herself her heirs and assigns ever and confirm with off and defend the said bargain and premises with every part and parcel thereof with all its rights privileges and advantages unto the said Edward Crompter his heirs and assigns forever And from all the claim or claims all persons whosoever In Testimony whereof we the parties have hereunto set our hands and seals this day and then as is before written
