This Indenture made this 16<sup>th</sup> day of April 1830 between Jacob Williams of the County  
and William Williams of the same part Witnesseth that whereas one Elisha Williams  
with his wife made a deed of Gift which has been duly recorded conveying to Edw<sup>m</sup> Turner  
in a former deed certain property which was to be conveyed absolutely to the said William  
Williams upon the death of Elisha Williams and his wife Elizabeth Williams the said  
Edw<sup>m</sup> Turner being to whom the power was given by deed of conveying the property  
did declare that of this County as provided in this place Jacob Williams with the same powers and  
privileges as were granted to Edw<sup>m</sup> Turner and the contingencies therein specified in the deed  
happened namely the death of Elisha Williams and his wife Elizabeth Williams the last of them  
being by this deed bearing date the day and year above mentioned conveyed the same and other  
right conveyed to Edw<sup>m</sup> Turner and by the said Edw<sup>m</sup> Turner to Jacob Williams  
all the right title and interest whatsoever growing out of the following property to William  
Williams and his heirs forever to their own and proper use Viz a tract of Land lying in the  
County bounded by a swamp called Duckhorn more part by the land of Elisha Williams  
another part and by the land of Thomas Foster on another containing six hundred and  
fifty four acres and also the following negroes Viz a Col. (Sylvia was conveyed to  
and Redina. Jacob Williams trustee doth convey by these presents the within interest  
vested in them in the above named property to the said William Williams and his heirs  
forever In proof whereof he hath their unite set his hand and affixed his seal this day  
and year before mentioned
