

This Indenture made this 17th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty between Richard Booth and Elizabeth his wife of the County of Surrey of the one part and Thomas Dibbath of the County of Suffolk of the other part witnesseth that the said Richard Booth and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of the sum of One Pound and dollars to him in hand paid or to be paid by the said Thomas Dibbath at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Richard Booth and Elizabeth his wife do hereby acknowledge have bargained and sold or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation one hundred and twenty acres by the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit by the lands of the late Major Edward Bailey and on the north on the west by the lands of John Sholman on the south by the land belonging to the heirs of Joseph Blart and together with all and singular the appurtenances thereunto belonging in and to the sum and remanence and remains and remains yearly and other rents, issues and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every right, member, appurtenance unto the said Thomas Dibbath his heirs and assigns forever and the said Richard Booth and Elizabeth his wife and their heirs the said tract or parcel of land with all and singular the premises aforesaid before mentioned unto the said Thomas Dibbath his heirs and assigns free from the claim of them the said Richard Booth and Elizabeth his wife their or either of them heirs and all and every person or persons whomsoever shall live and be wanting and forever defend by these presents.
