That I, in recollecting made an entry into this 17<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty between Charles S. Johnson and Elizabeth his wife of eleven years and Jonathan Bryant of the other part witnesseth that the said Charles S. Johnson and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of seven hundred and fifty dollars current money to them in hand paid. Slave bargaining with the said Jonathan Bryant by trustee presents de and each of them with his signature and seal unto the said Jonathan Bryant recd Cet 14/1/1835. Tract or parcel of Land containing by estimation one hundred and forty four acre more or less bounded as follows. Beginning at a pine corner tree for said parcel of land the Williams branch and the land belonging to Jacob Miller's Estate thence down the run of the said branch to a Black gum a corner for said Jonathan P. Bryant Bailey Bryant Jacob Miller Estate and the aforesaid parcel of land thence along a line of marked trees to a dog wood marking and thence to a pine a corner tree thence along a line of marked trees to a Black gum a corner in Silarus or Cypress line thence up the run of a Branch to a white oak and along a line of trees to a post on Middlemire Bates line and thence to the beginning with the reservation and reservations remaining and remaining open and other rights appurtenant profits and rents for ever and parcels thereof except only the reversionary interest in and to the part of the tract of Land as may appear to Lewis Doyles wisdom as his donor on said tract of Land and to hold said tract of Land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular the other menses herein before bargained and sold with every of them right member?
