This Indenture ^{tripartite} made and executed this 19th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty between John W. Reese of the first part, Drury Pettie of the second part and Auburn Middleton who is mutually chosen as Trustee of the third part, all of the Parish of St. Luke and County of Southampton, Wm. & P. M. that with and the said Drury Pettie as aforesaid, the said John W. Reese had before him as his security in two separate notes or Bonds, one executed on the 15th day of February 1830, for the sum of about three hundred dollars payable to Richard Porter and the other executed on the 13th day of February same year for the sum of Three hundred and twenty three dollars and thirty one cents payable to Auburn Middleton six months after its date. And the said John W. Reese being desirous to secure and secure harmless the said Drury Pettie from all losses injury or other inconvenience or trouble which he might be subject to in consequence of his having become security as aforesaid, he agreed to convey in Trust for the benefit and use of the said Drury Pettie to Auburn Middleton as Trustee the following property to wit: Negro man named Moses and Gail Obarrant, four head of horses two mules and twenty four head of cattle. And this Indenture further Wm. & P. M. that John W. Reese and in consideration of the circumstances aforesaid as well as for and on consideration of the sum of one dollar to me in hand paid by the said Auburn Middleton as Trustee aforesaid, he did give, grant, bargain and sell, make over and convey unto the said Auburn Middleton as Trustee aforesaid the aforesaid following property to wit: Negro man named Gail Obarrant, four head of horses two mules and twenty head of cattle in Trust and when the aforesaid condition that should the said Drury Pettie hereafter sustain any inconvenience from the having ship aforesaid by being laid or having to pay money, or otherwise incur himself in danger of being by reason of the said ship aforesaid as well as in other cases wherein he may hereafter become bound for the said John W. Reese that then and in that case it shall be lawful and lawful to him then intent and meaning of these presents for the said Auburn Middleton as Trustee aforesaid or his assigns at the request of the said Drury Pettie or John W. Reese or their representatives to sell the aforesaid property for cash at such place as a majority of the parties hereto may agree upon after giving at least ten days notice thereof and out of the proceeds of such sale first paying satisfy all sums of money which the said Drury Pettie may have paid or be bound to pay or apprehending danger of paying by reason of the said ship aforesaid all costs and reasonable charges incurred in aforesaid suits and the balance of any sum over to the said John W. Reese or such person as may be authorized to receive it all of which is intended to be the true intention meaning and object for which this present writing is executed. And the said John W. Reese do hereby warrant and defend the title of the said property to Auburn Middleton as Trustee aforesaid. In Wm. & P.
