 named Winny one sorrel mare and one bay mare. To have and to hold to her only proper use and behoof forever
 upon Trust and stipulation that the said Nathaniel Keble is to retain possession of the said woman Winny
 and two mares until the said Seth R Strong and his or their Executors administrators or assigns shall direct the said
 Keble or his Executor or assigns to take possession of the same and after duly accounting in the same and place of
 sale for twenty days the said Keble as Trustee as aforesaid shall sell the said woman Winny & two mares
 as may be necessary to satisfy the debt and interest aforesaid to the highest bidder for cash out of the proceeds
 of such sale pay first the expenses of the Trust then the debt aforesaid with the interest which may have
 accrued thereon and the balance if any pay to the said Keble. And if the said Keble or his Executor or assigns
 before the said sale shall have been made shall pay to the said Seth R Strong Esq. then his or
 assigns the said sum of money with the interest thereon and the costs thereof then the said Seth R Strong
 Esq. covenants that the said woman Winny and two mares shall be fully released to him the said
 Nathaniel Keble of this indenture and the said Keble covenants that

 thousand and four hundred and thirteen dollars to him in hand paid by the said Johnson before the sealing and
 delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold
 and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said John Johnson a certain tract of land
 part of that devised to him the said Benjamin Lewis father of the said John Johnson in his last will and Testament
 situate in the County aforesaid and described in a second survey made by George H Gray County Surveyor as
 beginning at an oak in John Johnson's field at the corner of said land and said Lewis's field
 thence up the various corners of said Lewis's field to the head leading to Williamson's store thence along said
 road south 61. 11. 0 p. 131. 11. 11. 2 p. 537. 8. 179 p. to a corner Hickory in said Johnson's line thence 72
