That Indenture made and entered into this 29th day of April one thousand eight hundred and thirty between Bennett Edwards and Drury his wife of the one part and Amos Stephenson of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Whose full and entire contents are as follows to wit: That Bennett Edwards and Drury his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Ten dollars unto lawful money of the Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Amos Stephenson at & before the signing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof being acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and conveyed and by these presents do grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Amos Stephenson one certain tract or parcel of land containing two acres be the dimensions or less and more as follows to wit: Beginning at a red oak by the side of the road a corner between Henry (Bennett) and the aforesaid tract thence along the said Henry's line to a pine on Elton and thence a straight line to a white oak in Bennet's line a corner and thence along Stephenson's line to the road and thence down the road to the first station and supposing to contain two acres more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said Amos Stephenson his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said Amos Stephenson his heirs and assigns forever and the said Bennett Edwards and Drury his wife for themselves their heirs and assigns forever and assigns to and with the said Amos Stephenson his heirs and assigns that they will forever bear and defend the right and title of the aforesaid land and from all other persons or persons whatsoever In Testimony whereof they the said Bennett Edwards and Drury his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixation of seals this day and date above written

That Indenture made this 10th day of May in the year of our Lord 1830 between George Edmon of the County of Isle of Wight of the first part and Samuel Edmon and Oms A Brown of the County of Southampton of the second part Whereas the said George Edmon Executed his mortgage to William B. Edmon of the County of Southampton on the 10th day of 1828 in which the said Samuel Edmon and Oms A Brown his executors and assigns were bound by the said George Edmon the said Samuel Edmon and Oms A Brown well have the sum to pay and have actually made assignments and engagements to discharge the same and for the purpose of assuring indemnity of the said Samuel Edmon and Oms A Brown in the above behalf as far as in law they are in the event of them having the said Amount to pay without force of the said Indenture therefore they certify that the said George Edmon for and in consideration as well of the terms aforesaid as of the sum of dollars to him in hand paid by the said Samuel B. Edmon and Oms A Brown before the execution and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said George Edmon doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Samuel Edmon and Oms A Brown and to their heirs and assigns forever all right title interest or expectancy which the said George Edmon may have or propose whether as a contingent or on remainder under the will of his late father Grandfather Martha Edmon which is of record in the Clerk's Office in the County of Southampton and bears date the 29th of March 1818 as also all right title or interest which he may have or propose in any way or in any manner in the Estate of his late father Robert Edmon and in any estate which either contingent or remainder or reversionary which he the said George Edmon may propose in any way or in any manner provided that if the said George Edmon his heirs executors or assigns shall ever and shall ever and truly pay a debt to the
