L. C. Fitzgerald and Fitzgerald agent their execution administration or assigns the said sum of fifty dollar and six dollar & one cent and the balance of any shall pay to the said Henry Horn his heirs execution administration or assigns: But if the whole of the said sum of Fifty six dollar and one cent shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said D. Fitzgerald and Fitzgerald agent their execution administration or assigns on or before the 25th day of December 1830 when the same is payable so that no default of the payment of the sum of Fifty Dollars & six dollar & one cent be made then this indenture to be void and to remain in full force and virtue. Morris of the County and State aforesaid in the just and full sum of one hundred and twenty dollars due by note and dated the first day of May 1830 and being desirous and willing to secure the true payment thereof as well for the aforesaid sum of one hundred and twenty dollar and also one dollar to me in hand paid by the said John A. Person the trust whereof is hereby acknowledged I the said Thomas Johnson have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said John A. Person his heirs and assigns the following property to wit one barrel of best head of head the crop cotton com fodder and three barrels of braney the household and kitchen furniture and other goods &c also two oxen pigs and one apple tree To have and to hold the aforesaid property as a special trust and consideration to the intent and purpose that if the aforesaid sum of one hundred and twenty dollar shall remain unpaid to the said John A. Person his heirs or assigns shall after giving ten days notice expose the aforesaid property to public sale at any time after the 25th day of December next and with the money and inquiries from said sale pay and satisfy the aforesaid sum of one hundred and twenty dollar as also the expense attending the execution of this trust and the surplus if any return to me my heirs &c.
