This Indenture made the 17 day of May 1830 between John R. Williams of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and Honell Harris of the second and Joseph T. Claus of the third part Whereas the said John R. Williams is justly indebted to the said Joseph T. Claus the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars due by note bearing date May 17th 1830 and the said John R. Williams being extingished and sundry to secure the payment of the same also for the term of one year in and to the said Honell Harris at and before the dealing and delivery of these presents he the said John R. Williams have bargained sold and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Honell Harris his heirs and assigns the said John R. Williams for himself his heirs &c doth hereby covenant promise and agree to sell the said John R. Williams his heirs &c in manner and form following that to wit that the said John R. Williams his heirs &c for the aforesaid negro girl and boy Andrew truly coming is and take the profits thereof his own use until default be made in the payment of the aforesaid sum of one hundred and fifty dollars either in part or in the whole and then upon his failure trust and so down as default be made the said Honell Harris his heirs &c shall after given legal notice expose the said negro girl and boy to public sale and out of the proceed of such sale pay the aforesaid sum of one hundred and fifty dollars with interest and cost and the balance if any pay the said John R. Williams his heirs &c but if the whole of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars shall be paid off and discharged to the said Joseph T. Claus his heirs &c on or before the 31 day of January 1831 then this Indenture with all other acts to remain in full force and virtue

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound James Munday has been duly appointed by the Court of Southampton County to serve as Constable in the said County from June Term 1831 in the term of

will and truly discharge the duties of the Office of Constable in the said County during his continuance therein then the above obligation to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue
