This Indenture made this 8 day of May Eighteen Hundred and thirty Between George Stephenson of the first part Plaintiff and one of the said parties and George Williams of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia: Witnesseth that whereas the said George Stephenson as partly indebted to the said George Williams in the first and full sum of sixty dollars and twenty nine cents bearing equal date with these presents and whereas the said George Stephenson is indebted to the said George Williams in the above sum of sixty dollars and twenty nine cents and whereas the said George Williams has been paid by the said George Stephenson the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said George Williams the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said George Williams his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit one Norrell man and a half of Corn and fodder And to hold the aforesaid property to him the said George Williams his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said George Williams his heirs and assigns forever and to the Special Credit and Confidence of him the said George Williams and to and for the use intents and purposes following that is to say that the said George Williams at any time hereafter whenever he shall be requested by the said George Williams make sale of the aforesaid property (viz) one Norrell man and a half of Corn and fodder at public Auction or so much thereof as he may think fitly the aforesaid claim with interest and costs that may accrue thereon by advertising the date of such sale at least three public places as the said George Williams may think proper so as to read or complete Justice to the parties at least ten days previous notice to the day of sale for ready money and out of the proceeds of such sales pay unto the said George Williams his heirs and assigns the full amount of the above claim together with interest and costs thereof if the same be in effect of these presents and the proceeds of any sale pay unto the said George Stephenson his heirs and assigns.
