This Indenture made the 14th day of April in the year of one Lord one thousand Eight hundred & thirty
 Between Aaron Johnson of the first part Abraham Parker of the second part and Aaron Johnson of the third
 the their part of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Whereas the said Aaron Johnson is
 jointly indebted to the said Abraham Parker in the sum of twenty four dollars and 41 Cents to be paid on or
 before the first day of April one thousand eight hundred and thirty three and legal interest thereon
 until paid as by the said term date with this Indenture which debt the said Aaron Johnson is willing
 and desirous to secure from therefore this Indenture that for and in consideration of the premises
 also for the further consideration of one dollar to him the said Aaron Johnson in hand paid by the said
 Abraham Parker at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 by the said Aaron Johnson hath given granted bargained and sold aliened off sold and Con-
 firmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien and off release and Confirm to the said
 Abraham Parker his heirs and assigns all that tract or parcel of Land which the said Aaron Johnson
 purchased of one James S. Gardner lying in the aforesaid County of Southampton adjoining the land
 of the late Abraham Gardner dec'd the late Edw. Robt. Matthew Laughon and others containing
 eighty seven and a half acres more or less all his stock of cattle sheep and hogs and his
 household and kitchen furniture and farming utensils together with all and singular cheap-
 pertainances to the said tract of Land belonging or in anywise appertaining and all the right title
 and interest of the said Aaron Johnson in and to the said personal property and to the trust
 granted or intended to be hereby granted promised To have and to hold the said tract or parcel
 of Land with the personal property also said unto the said Abraham Parker his heirs & assigns
 forever upon that nevertheless that as soon after the default of the payment of the aforesaid
 debt & interest as the said Abraham Parker shall think proper and shall request by a written notice
 he the said Abraham Parker shall proceed to sell the said personal property first and if insufficient
 to pay the debt then sell the said tract of Land to the highest bidder for ready money at public
 auction the time and place of sale having been given by three several advertisements one of which
 shall be posted up at the Court House door of said County of Southampton one some one Court
 day previous to the day of sale And out of the money arising from such sale first pay the
 necessary expenses and then the debt aforesaid and interest and the balance if any the said
 Abraham Parker shall pay to the said Aaron Johnson his heirs and assigns But if the whole
 of the said debt with interest thereon shall be fully paid off and discharged on or before the time herein
 specified when the same is made payable so that no default of payment be made then this Indenture to
 be null and void and of no effect else to be and remain in full force and virtue In witness
