This Indenture made this 25<sup>th</sup> Day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and thirty between James Clayton of the first part, Joseph Soyner of the second part and Willborne Stephenson of the third part. Whereas the said Joseph Soyner on the 25<sup>th</sup> Day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty eight in order to secure the payment of the sum of Forty six dollars and twenty eight cents to the said Willborne Stephenson did by Indenture dated of that date convey to the said James Clayton his heirs Executors &c. the following property acres bounded by the Lands of James Clayton James Johnson and Jesse Johnson upon that for the uses and purposes in the said Indenture mentioned And whereas since the execution and delivering of the said Deed of that date the said Joseph Soyner hath fully satisfied &c. paid to the said Willborne Stephenson the several sums of money thereby secured which the said Willborne Stephenson doth hereby acknowledge from this Indenture it is expressed that for the considerations aforesaid as well as for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Joseph Soyner to the said James Clayton at and before the making and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said James Clayton with the assent and approbation of the said Willborne Stephenson signified by his being party to these presents and the said Willborne Stephenson have granted bargained and sold promised released and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain and sell remise release &c. confirm unto the said Joseph Soyner all the Estate right title interest claim and demand both at Law and in Equity which the said James Clayton and Willborne Stephenson have or hold in the land above described To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land to the said Joseph Soyner his heirs Executors and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Joseph Soyner his heirs Executors and assigns forever and the said James Clayton and Willborne Stephenson for themselves their heirs Executors and assigns the above mentioned Land unto the said Joseph Soyner his heirs Executors and assigns in and full and ample manner as the same are warranted by the said Joseph Soyner by the deed of that date recited do warrant the same to the said Joseph Soyner against the claim or claims of them the said James Clayton and Willborne Stephenson and all persons claiming by or under them or either of them In Witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above written
