 John Cobb of the same County and State of the second part and James H. Holland of the same County and State
 of the third part Witnesseth that whereas the said Archer & Gardner should pretty much be into
 the said John Cobb in the past and full term of twenty six dollars and twenty five cents amounting
 of Mr. John Cobb appears by Bond bearing date which these presents and made payable from the date then
 know the said Archer & Gardner being all ill and desirous to and money and secure the payment
 of the above debt but more especially for the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by him the said
 James H. Holland before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 (1836) that he the said Archer & Gardner hath granted bargain and sold and sold by these
 presents grant bargain and sell to him the said James H. Holland his heirs and assigns forever
 the following property to wit two fatherhood and furniture 1 Cor 2 hogs 2 Chest 1 pair 1 Sheep out of
 the balance of property I am possessed with to him the said James H. Holland his heirs and assigns
 forever upon the following trust to wit that if the said Archer & Gardner shall fail to pay and
 discharge the above mentioned debt and all costs pertaining to this trust it shall be lawful for the said
 James H. Holland for him the said Archer & Gardner do soon as requested in writing from him the said
 James H. Holland his heirs or assigns to set up and sell for cash the above mentioned property after giving public
 notice by advertisement to be set up at different places in the neighborhood of the said Archer &
 Gardner at least twenty days before the day of sale and out of the money so raised first pay the above
 debt and all costs pertaining to this trust and the surplus if any pay over to him the said Archer &
 Gardner his heirs or assigns in full payment of the said debt and the parties have set our hand and sealed this day of
 year just above written

This Indenture made and entered into this seventh day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred
 and thirty six between James Myrick of the County of Southampton of the first part Richard P. Nicholson
 of the second part and John J. Mason of the third part Whereas the above named James Myrick is
 indebted to the said Mason in the sum of five hundred thirty eight dollars 75¢ 100 due by bond of this
 date and whereas the said James Myrick is willing and desirous to secure the payment of the balance
 of money with interest thereon This Indenture therefore Witnesseth that for and in consideration
 the promises and of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said James Myrick hath granted bargain and sold and sold by these
 presents grant bargain and sell to him the said Richard P. Nicholson his heirs and assigns forever
 and by these presents doth bargain sell grant and convey unto the said Richard P. Nicholson his heirs
 and assigns that certain tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Southampton containing five acres
 Myrick by Alexander P. Tate, as attested by the said James Myrick and also the following negro slaves to wit
 and sixty five acres with the appurtenances and also the following negro slaves to wit Patrick Jack by
 Cambridge Fetus Harry Beck Matilda Nancy Mary Beck and Eben subject however to the
 first use unto the said John J. Mason to secure the payment of a sum of money to the above named
 P. Tate as and as aforesaid in the date of Trust Bearer date the 21 day of April 1836 and is of record
 in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County Land To have and to hold the said land and appurtenances
 and the said negro slaves subject to the in commission aforesaid to him the said Richard P. Nicholson
 his heirs or assigns forever upon this Special Trust Nevertheless that the said Richard P.
 Nicholson on being thus required by the said Mason or his assigns the said sum of money
 due and unpaid by the said Myrick shall proceed to sell the said tract of Land and said negro slaves
