This Indenture made this 25th day of May in the year then and Eight hundred and thirty between Thomas M. Battle of the County of Southampton of the one part and Joseph Clanton of the County of Sussex of the other part Witnesseth that Whereas the said Thomas M. Battle stands jointly indebted to the Honor of the County of Sussex by Bond in the penal sum of Four hundred Dollars conditioned to pay and deliver unto him the said George M. M. the sum of two hundred dollars with legal interest thereon from the 1st day of January 1831 by the said Thomas M. Battle and whereas for the further assurance of the said payment it is agreed by the parties hereto that a mortgage in and shall be made by the said Thomas M. Battle to the said Joseph Clanton for the benefit of the said George M. M. in case the said Bond with legal interest thereon shall not be promptly paid Now this Indenture witnesseth that in the said Thomas M. Battle for and in consideration of the premises and for the further sum of one dollar to him the said Thomas M. Battle in hand paid at or before the making and delivery of these presents by the said Joseph Clanton the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold unto by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Joseph Clanton his heirs and assigns the following property to wit the growing crops of Corn fodder and Cotton which he the said Thomas M. Battle is now cultivating on the plantation of the late Mr. Martha Rogers and in Southampton County also the corn and fodder now on the said plantation for its seed and consumption during the year 1830 this being included in the deed to secure and ensure the means of cultivating the growing Crops to its maturity which alone would secure effectually the within Debt intended to be secured also a Bay horse the entire stock of Cattle and Cattle which the said Thomas M. Battle now has and may have when this deed is finally executed and the said property here above named and conveyed by this deed is to remain in the Cattle and land of the said Thomas M.
