This Indenture made the 25th day of May in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and Thirty second, Joseph Mornble and Sarah his wife of Southampton County of one part and John Crompler of the aforesaid County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Joseph Mornble and Sarah his wife for and in consideration of twenty five dollars lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said John Crompler at or before the sealing and delivery of this present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said John Crompler their undivided proportion of Dower in the land formerly belonging to Jesse Mornble deceased containing ninety six acres be the same more or less together with all the singular houses buildings gardens orchards &c and the reversion and reversions remainder and remainments To have and to hold the said undivided proportion of the above named Land with the tenements buildmgs and all and singular other the premises therein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold as aforesaid by parcel thereof as at any of their rights &c to the said John Crompler his heirs and assigns forever and the said Joseph Mornble and Sarah his wife for themselves and their heirs the said parcel of Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said John Crompler his heirs and assigns forever from the claim of claims of them the said Joseph Mornble Sarah his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs their or either of their heirs whatsoever shall arise and do demand and receive by these presents In witness whereof the said Joseph Mornble and Sarah his wife have set their hands and shall the day and date first written hereunder
